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NRC TO DISCUSS ANNUAL PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT OF JAMES A. FITZPATRICK NUCLEAR POWER PLANT

Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will meet with representatives of Entergy Nuclear Generation Company on Wednesday, April 9, to discuss the results of the agency's annual assessment of safety performance at the James A. FitzPatrick nuclear power plant. The facility is located in Scriba, N.Y.

The meeting, which will be open to the public for observation, is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. at the Emergency Operations Facility/Joint News Center for the plant, located at the Oswego County Airport, 2262 N.Y. State Route 176 in Fulton, N.Y. Before the session is adjourned, NRC staff will be available to answer questions from the public on the safety performance of the FitzPatrick plant, as well as the role of the NRC in ensuring safe plant operation.

The performance period to be discussed is January 1 to December 31, 2002. In addition, NRC staff will provide an overview of how the agency's Reactor Oversight Process works.

"Overall, FitzPatrick operated in a manner that preserved public health and safety, and fully met all cornerstone objectives," the letter states. Therefore, the NRC plans to conduct only baseline inspections at the site through March 31, 2004.

The letter also notes: "As you are aware, since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the NRC has issued several Orders and threat advisories to enhance security capabilities and improve guard force readiness. We have conducted inspections to review your implementation of these requirements and have monitored your actions in response to changing threat conditions. For calendar year 2003, we plan to continue these inspections, conduct portions of the security baseline inspection

program, as well as perform additional inspections to evaluate your compliance with new requirements that may be ordered. “
