Dear Mr. O'Dowd:

We have reviewed the proposed changes to the New Hampshire Rules for the Control of Radiation, Administrative Code He-P 4000, received by our office on March 30, 2005. These regulations were reviewed by comparison to the equivalent Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules in 10 CFR Parts 20, 30, 31, 32, 34, 35, 36, 39, 71 and 150 and the requirements of the 10 amendments identified in the enclosed State Regulation Status (SRS) Data Sheet. We discussed our review of the regulations with you on April 8, 2005.

As a result of our review, we have eleven comments that have been identified in the enclosure. Please note that we have limited our review to regulations required for compatibility and/or health and safety. Under our current procedure, a finding that the New Hampshire regulations meet the compatibility and health and safety categories of the equivalent NRC regulation may only be made based on a review of the final New Hampshire regulations. However, we have determined that if your proposed regulations were adopted, incorporating our comments and without other significant change, they would meet the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of State and Tribal Programs (STP) Procedure SA-200.

We request that when the proposed regulations are adopted and published as final regulations, a copy of the "as published" regulations be provided to us for review. As requested in STP Procedure SA-201, "Review of State Regulatory Requirements," please highlight the final changes and provide a copy to STP.

The SRS Data Sheet summarizes our knowledge of the status of other New Hampshire regulations, as indicated. Please let us know if you note any inaccuracies, or have any comments on the information contained in the SRS Data Sheet.
