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NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET JUNE 4-6 IN ROCKVILLE, MD

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) will hold a public meeting June 4-6 in Rockville, Md., to discuss, among other items, designs of both the Evolutionary Power Reactor and the U.S. Advanced Pressurized Water Reactor; and the status of activities associated with the development of rules and regulatory guidance in the safeguards and security areas. The ACRS will also discuss the resolution of Generic Safety Issue 191: the assessment of debris accumulation on pressurized-water reactor sump performance at nuclear power plants.

The ACRS advises the Commission, independently from the NRC staff, on licensing and operation of nuclear power plants and related safety issues.

The meeting will be held in Room T-2B3 of the agency's Two White Flint North building, at 11545 Rockville Pike. Wednesday's session will run from 8:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., Thursday's session will run from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Friday's session will run from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. A complete agenda is available on the NRC's Web site at: <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/acrs/agenda/2008>.
