IAEA Nuclear Security Culture

- Implementing Guide (Nuclear Security Series No. 7 – 2008)
- Purpose – to serve as an introduction to security culture for regulators, licensees, managers, individual workers and the public
- Defines roles and responsibilities
- Describes characteristics of security culture including observable attributes



Consideration of Safety-Security Interface

- Risk and Consequences
 - Safety – Inadvertent actions
 - Security – Deliberate/malicious acts
 - Shared objective of limiting risk and consequences

- Information
 - Safety – promotes sharing of information
 - Security – restrict based on need-to-know



Treatment of Safety/Security Culture

- Separate policy statements, one for safety culture and one for security culture
- Joint policy statement – A safety and security culture policy statement where safety and security are treated equally
