NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET JUNE 8-10 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards (ACRS) will hold a public meeting June 8-10 in Rockville, Md., to discuss several issues of current interest. Some of the topics include:

- Draft Regulatory Guides DG-1261, "Conducting Periodic Testing for Breakaway Oxidation Behavior," DG-1262, "Testing for Postquench Ductility," and DG-1263, "Establishing Analytical Limits for Zirconium-Based Alloy Cladding;"
- the revised Safety Evaluation Report associated with the license renewal application for the Hope Creek Generating Station; and
- a Commission Paper on Level 3 probabilistic risk assessment activities.

The ACRS advises the Commission, independently from the NRC staff, on safety issues related to the licensing and operation of nuclear power plants and in areas of health physics and radiation protection. The meeting will be held in Room T-2B1 of the agency's Two White Flint North building, at 11545 Rockville Pike. The session on June 8 will run from 8:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The June 9 session will run from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and the June 10 session will run from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Portions of the meeting may be closed to discuss proprietary information, as well as organizational and personnel matters.
